1. ***Who are the members of the governing body?*** The members of the governing body are the thirty-eight teaching elders who are members of Abingdon Presbytery, the ten Commissioned Ruling Elders, and the forty-eight ruling elder commissioners that represent the forty-eight congregations of the Presbytery. For the purpose of this meeting of Presbytery, the members of the Presbytery are signified by either a **blue dot** or a **yellow dot** on your name tag that you received when you registered for this meeting of Presbytery. A **blue dot** on your name tag signifies that you are a minister member of Presbytery, while a **yellow dot** indicates that you are an elder commissioner. For this meeting of Presbytery, only minister members and elder commissioners have the privilege of voice and vote at this meeting. If you do not have either a **blue dot or a yellow dot** on your name tag, then you do not have the privilege of voice or vote at this meeting, only those members in attendance with either a **blue dot or a yellow dot** on their name tag have the privilege of addressing the Presbytery and voting on action items before the governing body.
2. If you are wearing an adhesive name tag, this signifies that you are a visitor to this meeting of Presbytery. If the way be clear, then visitors will be permitted to speak and participate in the round table discussions, but shall not be allowed to speak in the plenary discussion or vote on issues before the Presbytery.

I was born in San Diego California, at the Naval Station. My father was in the Navy. At the end of the Korean war, my mother and father moved back to Springfield, Oregon, where I was raised.

I graduated from Thurston Senior High in 1971 and went to work at Weyerhaeuser's paper-mill where my father worked. In 1975 I went to Wrangell, Alaska with a friend. Eventually, I married and in 1976 my wife, Marla and I had our first child, Marissa, who was born with Spina-bifida.

We remained in Wrangell, where I worked in the timber industry in logging and eventually, in road building operations. In 1990, I went to work at Alaska Lumber and Pulp the local saw mill where I operated equipment in the log-sort yard.

We had joined the Presbyterian church in town in 1983. I become involved in the church and served on Session. A few years later our pastor accepted a call further north and we were without a minister for some time. Living in a small town we soon exhausted our supply of potential guess ministers.

I decided to try preaching to fill the pulpit and was surprised to discover that I enjoyed it. Eventually we called a pastor couple. They were my age and we became good friends. I had become curious about what was required to enter into ministry in the Presbyterian church. I was told that I would need a Masters Degree. I had barely graduated from high school. We didn't see how we could sell our house and go back college.

In 1995, the mill closed leaving our family in an awkward situation. My wife and I had both worked at the mill. We had three children and no real job prospects. We had both talked about going back to school but had been pretty comfortable in Wrangell, but the mill closure actually served as the catalyst to make the big change for us go to seminary.

Our pastors had gone to the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa. We discovered that the seminary had a "3/3" program where you could get your degrees (BA and MDiv) in six years instead of the usual seven.

Marla had felt the call too and that year we moved to Dubuque and began college. While we were in college, we served as co-student pastors to a small rural congregation in Andrew Iowa. It provided us with much good practical experience, in ministry.

We both graduated from UDTs in 2002. We began seeking a call. I finally accepted a call to Faith Presbyterian church in Melrose, Florida in the fall of 2002.

In 2008, Marla joined me in ministry at Faith. She preached every other Sunday and took over the bulk of pastoral care. I secured employment outside the church but continued to be active in the worship team.

Eventually, the church could no longer afford us. I had ignored the signs (declining membership due to deaths in the congregation) and could not afford to sell our house and seek another call elsewhere. In 2012 the Committee on Ministry officially dissolved our relationship with Faith church.

Life and all of the attendant requirements continued as usual. I had to have a job and income in a relatively short time. I still had friends from my time in the logging and construction industries. I called a friend of mine who was working in the oilfields in Wyoming. He said there were jobs there and the pay was good.

I went to Wyoming in 2012 and worked there driving truck until 2016. During this period Marla and I had been separated as she had remained in Florida. In 2014 she filed for divorce. I waited for a year hoping that we could reconcile. Finally, in 2015 I agreed and the divorce was finalized.

I grew tired of being alone and began seeking another partner. I decided that the next woman I would share my life with would have to love music as much as I did. Leatha and I had been friends and had worked together on the praise team at faith. I contacted her and suggested that we might get together.

In 2016 I moved from Wyoming back to Keystone Heights (next to Melrose) where Leatha was finishing her career as a speech therapist at the local elementary school. We married in August of that year.

I worked at various jobs until 2018. I worshipped with the folks at the local Methodist church and joined their praise team. Still, I missed preaching and began looking at positions on the presbytery website. I was looking at MIFs when I found St. Andrews church, who were looking for a half-time pastor. I became their pastor in 2018. I have been serving at St Andrews since then.
